Time Commitment: 3-4 hour shifts per event, 2 events per calendar year

Day of Week: Often Saturdays, variable

Location: Indianapolis metro area

These volunteers will get to meet people from all over the state, network with TNC staff, and add much appreciated support to our Inspiring People for Nature outreach programming.

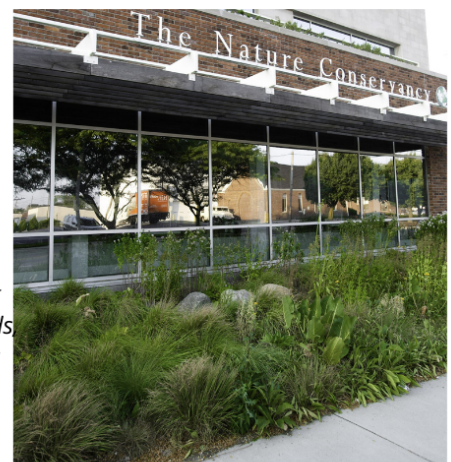
Duties may include:

- Talking to the general public about the Conservancy's conservation work
- Answering essential questions about who the Conservancy is and what we do
- Connecting visitors with resources and information related to conservation
- Picking up booth materials from the TNC office
- Setting up booth displays in a visually engaging manner
- Running a giveaway game or other activity
- Tracking FAQs and number of visitors to booth
- Breaking down booth displays, packing items, and returning them to the office
- Maintaining Youth Safety Qualification as required by TNC
- Adhering to TNC Code of Conduct and our Values
- Supporting other outreach activities as interested and available
